

# COMMUNITY BASED PROGRAMS - GIRLS

## Treasure Home

### THE PROGRAM

Treasure Home is a community-based treatment setting that provides an array of treatment services for adolescent girls ages 13 to 19. The program has a capacity for 12 girls and is supervised by a master's-level clinician.

- Gender: Female
- Ages: 13 to 19
- Average length of stay: Nine months
- Able to function in community school, or able to maintain employment if a high school diploma or GED is obtained
- Assessed as having developmental delays
- Moderately to severely emotionally disabled
- Able to function, with support, in the community (i.e. using public transportation and other resources)
- Not actively suicidal/homicidal at time of admission
- Not in need of medical detoxification

### THE TREATMENT

Treasure Home offers a high degree of structure and support in order to assist the young women in functioning successfully in a community-based environment. While continuing to recognize individual treatment needs, the program emphasizes independence from the institutional setting by teaching activities of daily living, use of community resources, participation in community services and career skills.

On-site services include:

- Individual, group and family therapy
- Life skills training
- Substance abuse assessment and services, including educational groups, substance abuse support groups and mentors
- Mentor-mentee relationship with youth counselors
- Physical and recreational activities
- Employment skills training and assistance in securing a job (when appropriate)
- Community service projects

### EDUCATION

Educational services are available at the on-campus Maryhurst School in partnership with the Jefferson County Public Schools, or in mainstream public schools. Some teens transition to local colleges. An Educational Liaison serves as an advocate for children enrolled in community-based schools and works with those attending GED, vocational or higher education programs.



Maryhurst is a private, 501(c)(3), not-for-profit agency dedicated to changing for the better the lives of "children in greatest need."

Maryhurst provides residential, in-home and community-based treatment programs to severely traumatized children, most often victims of sexual, physical, and/or emotional abuse or neglect. Our agency is fully licensed as a child caring, child placement and adoption service provider in Kentucky, serving more than 400 children and families each year.

Maryhurst has earned national prestige and is:

- Nationally accredited by the Council on Accreditation for Children and Family Services

- A field-placement site for graduate and undergraduate study in human services

- A member of the Children's Alliance: Kentucky's voice for at-risk children and families
