Every year it is such a privilege to celebrate Maryhurst's impact at our Journey of Hope Luncheon, so here are some highlights:

- We shared a video describing our partnership with the YMCA through which we place mental health professionals in identified out-of-school programs to help children and families in need of this service.
- A young woman named Madison talked about the continued support she has received since leaving our campus several years ago. Now a 24-year-old adult, she shared that our ongoing support made it possible for her to complete an associate's degree and have solid plans for moving on to work on a bachelor's program that will help her achieve true independence.
- Through our Supporting Your Dreams program, Maryhurst is awarding a total of \$47,990 to 16 alums to help them with continuing education, professional training, vocational support, and expenses related to establishing and maintaining stability.
- Poet and Maryhurst volunteer, Robin G., courageously spoke about the trauma she overcame in her own life and how this has driven her to making a difference for others.

THANK YOU CE&S FOUNDATION

Maryhurst is excited to receive a two-year grant from the CE&S Foundation that will help us embed mental health resources in "Out of School Time" (OST) programs throughout the city. We will be partnering with Kentucky Refugee Ministries, Neighborhood House, Sowing Seeds with Faith, and Americana Community Center to place trauma-trained professionals in each organization to provide ongoing support for their service users and staff. Our goal is to help more than 1,000 individuals during the two-year grant period.
