THANK YOU CE&S FOUNDATION


Maryhurst is excited to receive a two-year grant from the CE&S Foundation that will help us embed mental health resources in "Out of School Time" (OST) programs throughout the city. We will be partnering with Kentucky Refugee Ministries, Neighborhood House, Sowing Seeds with Faith, and Americana Community Center to place trauma-trained professionals in each organization to provide ongoing support for their service users and staff. Our goal is to help more than 1,000 individuals during the two-year grant period.
